"Me Bag" Activity

This Building on Background activity provides meaningful connections to personal narrative writing. In class, model this activity with your own "Me Bag". As a take-home activity, provide students with brown lunch bags and instruct them to fill their bags with a few personal items (i.e., objects, photos, magazine cut-outs) that represent some aspect of their lives (i.e., family, interests). Suggest that students decorate the bags (i.e., with magazine cut-outs or markers). In class, students share and discuss their bags and deliver short presentations about the items in their bags. Variations include:

"Me Box": Shoebox

"Me Map": Posterboard with magazine cut-outs, words, symbols and

photos

"Me Presentation": Web 2.0 Tool

- 2. What or who do you relate it to?
- 3. What did the object represent in the past?
- 4. What does it represent in the present?
- 5. Do you think it will maintain its value in the future?
